Message from the President



What is EOSARDA and Why Should I care?

To many of you EOSARDA is someone who shows up at your club from time-to-time to hand out pins or certificates. To others it's as an organization that puts on a Basic/Mainstream dance every year in the dead of winter.

But EOSARDA is much more than that.

- ⇒ It is the organization that publishes the magazine you are reading right now.
- ⇒ It is the organization that is responsible for creating and maintaining the web site that hosts the magazine you are reading right now.
- ⇒ It is the organization that sends out the electronic Bulletins that tell you, among other things, that this edition of Square Time can be found on the web site that hosts the magazine you are reading right now.

But EOSARDA is more than that.

EOSARDA's primary role is to promote modern square and round dancing by encouraging the growth and advancement of the square and round dance movement within Eastern Ontario by:

- ⇒ Providing assistance in the organization, development, and promotion of Clubs
- ⇒ Encouraging and assisting the development of Dance Leaders
- ⇒ Organizing and co-ordinating square and round dance functions and
- ⇒ Serving the members of the Association in the advancement and encouragement of modern square and round dancing.

This is accomplished through a number of programs, including, among other things :

- ⇒ subsidies to Member Clubs for recruiting new dancers;
- ⇒ financial assistance to Dance Leaders and would-be Dance Leaders for professional development;
- ⇒ the development and implementation of a regional publicity program
- ⇒ the identification and exploitation of opportunities to publicize dance activities in our region

- ⇒ ensuring that significant club events and anniversaries are suitably recognized
- ⇒ recognizing the efforts of our newest dancers by participation in new dancer celebrations
- ⇒ planning, organizing and running special regional dances

The Association is **not** a governing body. It exists to serve the needs of Member Clubs, our Dance Leaders and our dancers.

To deliver its programs, the Association relies on a small cadre of unpaid, volunteer Directors assisted by a few volunteers who do not sit on the Board of Directors. But, like many organizations, EOSARDA is having difficulty attracting enough people to allow it to carry out its mandate. We don't need a lot of additional help, but additional help is needed. Without that help many of the programs EOSARDA operates are in jeopardy. Some may have to be either suspended or, in the worst case, discontinued.

It's up to you.

You don't have to be an elite-level dancer.

You don't have to have many years of dancing experience.

You don't have to have any previous Board experience.

All you need is a love of dancing and a desire to help Square and Round Dancing grow and prosper. In return you will get to work with a fantastic team of individuals who share your passion for dancing.

"But", you say, "I am too busy to help".

We are all busy people. But we also care about dancing, so we make time to help it grow and prosper. And with enough people to share the load, it doesn't take all that much time anyway. On average EOSARDA business takes only a few hours a week, less time than most of us spend watching cute cat videos on Facebook or TikTok.


Are you a Facebook user? EOSARDA has a Facebook group that you can join. You can see posts for upcoming events and news. You can also post information yourself.

In Memorium Graham Ingram



Long-time square dance caller, round dance cuer, contradance prompter, music teacher, musician, band member, and music director – Graham Ingram – passed away March 7th at the Peter D. Clark Centre in Ottawa.

Graham started calling in the early 1980s and over the years called for many clubs in Eastern Ontario – including Village Squares, Country Cousins, Happy Squares, Date Squares, Mississippi Squares, Kanata Town Squares ... to mention some. Graham retired from calling in 2016 after more than 35 years with a microphone.

Creating and connecting communities through music was not just a hobby or pastime for Graham – it was a calling! His service to the Ontario square and round dance community was recognized in 2007 when he was awarded a Trillium Long Service Award.

A celebration of Graham's life was held on April 15th from 2:00 to 5:00 at Zion-Memorial United Church in Carleton Place. The afternoon was full of what Graham loved – music! There was also a square and round dance element to the event. The family promised that the afternoon would certainly not be traditional.

Rest easy, Graham ... we'll miss you – your dance family will keep the beat going on!



Quite a few years ago, my husband, Doug, and I screwed up our courage and, with great apprehension, entered the local public-school gymnasium. Our first lesson was about to begin. This was Doug's idea. After having recently rejoined the workforce, I felt guilty about being away from home and our young kids. However, once we hit the dance floor that evening, everything changed. We were smitten with square dancing.

The only dancing we had done prior to this was a shuffle: leaning on one foot, moving a little in any direction and then leaning on the other foot—back and forth and, with any luck, in time to the music.

With square dancing, though, we were learning an actual dance: exactly what to do with our feet, where to put our hands and where to go on the dance floor. To add to the fun, we danced with six other people, a total of four couples creating a square on the dance floor. We interacted with one another as the square-dance caller instructed. What a lot of fun! We had so many laughs, got some



exercise and made many friends. What more could a person ask for in an activity?

After square dancing for about six months and loving it, we realized there is a skill to learning all the various moves and recalling them when the caller tells us to perform each move. Only then did we realize that we had to shake off the fear of what people would think—and that we had to tell our family and friends what we had been up to. We even bragged about it!

Part of the fun is that no matter where in the world we might travel, we will be able to find a place to square dance—we learned that there are clubs everywhere. It seemed to us that modern-day square dancing had to be one of the best-kept secrets ever! There are several levels, so

there is a challenge in learning and performing the various moves. Perhaps that is why today's square dancing is recommended as a great low-impact exercise that is a wonderful workout for both the body and the mind. It helps keep you sharp as a tack!

After family, our social life revolves around the dance community of friends we have made over the years. And to think, we nearly did not go into the gymnasium for that first lesson! While Doug likes most sports, especially hockey, the only activity that appeals to me is square dancing—for me, it's like a contact sport! If we hadn't given it a try those years ago, we would have missed out on making lots of good friends—and on all that fun! ■

EOSARDA Visit Dangle Program is Up and Running!

Great News!!!!!! We want to remind all dancers that the EOSARDA Visit Dangle Program is up and running! It is very encouraging to see so many Clubs back on the dance floor and hosting dancers!

As a reminder, the best way for any dancer to become stronger is to dance more often, and visiting another club is a great way to do this!!!! The program runs from April 1st 2022 to August 31st, 2023.

Overview

The EOSARDA Club Visit Dangle is intended to encourage visits to EOSARDA Member Dance Clubs and attendance at Open Dances. It is awarded, upon application, to any registered dancer who completes the specific number of visits during the course of a single dance year. (September 1 through August 30). For the purposes of qualifying for this dangle the term "visit" includes:

- a visit to any EOSARDA Member Club of which you are not a member, on its regular club night
- attendance at any Open Dance hosted by an EOSARDA Member Club/Association
- attendance at any Open Dance hosted by EOSARDA



To obtain your dance dangle:

- Complete the required number of visits during a single dance year (only one club night visit per club per year per applicant please)
- Have the application form signed and dated as proof of your visit.
- Submit completed form to the Dance Dangle Manager or to your Club President on or before September 30 of the next dance year.

Achievement Levels

Silver Level: To earn a Silver Club Visit Dangle, a dancer must, during the course of a single dance year, undertake 5 "visits"

Gold Level: To earn a Gold Club Visit Dangle, a dancer must, during the course of a single dance year, undertake 8 "visits"

NOTE: The Skirts and Flirts Dance Club of Canton, New York, a former member of the Seaway Valley Square and Round Dance Association still qualifies to participate in this program. Thus, visits to or from Skirts N Flirts are eligible to be included on the application form.

If you have not participated in this program for this dance year, no problem, you can print out your form and plan on participating next dance year.



EOSARDA Club Visit Dangle - Application Form



Dance Year 20__/20__

The EOSARDA Club Visit Dangle Program is intended to encourage member dancer visits to EOSARDA Clubs and attendance at Open Dances.

For member visits during a single Dance Year: beginning September 1 and ending August 31 awards are presented for:

- Visiting any EOSARDA member Club of which you are not a member, on its regular dance night. (Only one such visit per year per applicant please).
- Attendance at any Open Dance hosted by EOSARDA or by EOSARDA together with a Member Club or Association.
- All visits must be made between Sep 01 and Aug 31 in a single dance year, i.e. that consecutive 12 month period.
- Achievement Levels: SILVER*: Dancer has made five (5) such visits.
 GOLD**: Dancer has made eight (8) such visits.

Completed form(s) must be sent to EOSARDA on or before September 30 of the next dance year. Submission can be made through the [Dance Dangle Manager](#) or your Club President. In addition, Michelle Gravelle & Sander Rosen (non-board members of the EOSARDA Liaison Committee) will accept forms on your behalf at their home address: 25-710 Coronation Avenue, Ottawa, ON, K1G 4G7. Celebrations





Please consider this, before deciding to go: if you are a current Basic or SSD dancer, this is *not* an open invitation for anyone to take these lessons. So, how do you decide if you should join them? Quite simply – if you are dependent on other dancers to dance successfully, you are NOT ready to "advance to the next dance program" (and that goes for ANY program, not just Mainstream). You need to be a competent dancer at Basic or SSD, dancing WITHOUT looking to other dancers to make sure you're in the right place at the right time. If you have any questions about it, ask your caller for their input. Dancing is MUCH MORE fun if you dance it correctly and easily, so don't take on more than you are ready for. It's not fair to yourself; it's not fair to other dancers; and it's not fair to the caller. ALWAYS be a VERY GOOD dancer at one program before deciding to try the next "level" of dancing. It will make learning the new stuff easier, and you'll enjoy it more! 😊

If you plan to attend to LEARN Mainstream, you can start on May 11 or 18. After that, it would be too late to join, as you would have already missed to many "teach" sessions. If you plan to attend for REVIEW, you are welcome any time.


